Global Benchmark Tool Updates

GSSI is updating its Global Benchmark Tool with thanks to the 2014 public consultation. The updated Tool includes GSSI Requirements, which Seafood Certification Schemes need to meet to be recognised by GSSI. These are grounded in the 'FAO Guidelines.'* At the same time the Tool includes GSSI Indicators, which let Schemes show their diverse approach and help stakeholders understand were differences exist.

*'FAO Guidelines' (FAO Guidelines for Ecolabelling of Fish and Fishery Products from Marine/Inland Fisheries and FAO Technical Guidelines for Aquaculture Certification)

Global Benchmark Tool Pilots

GSSI is road-testing its Global Benchmark Tool with pilots starting in April and running until July. A number of Seafood Certification Schemes have volunteered to be part of the pilots and test how the Tool works in practice together with Benchmark Experts. Results will not be made public but feedback from the pilots will help develop the final Tool to be launched later in 2015
